U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at Upper Deerfield Township Sanitary Landfill Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has completed its **fourth** Five-Year Review of the **Upper Deerfield Sanitary Landfill Superfund Site** located in Upper Deerfield Township, Cumberland County, New Jersey. This review seeks to confirm that the remedy is functioning as designed. The remedy for the site called for no further remedial action with a monitoring program of the air and groundwater.

What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- Review of monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records, and
- Determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
