

**TOWNSHIP OF UPPER DEERFIELD**

**RESOLUTION 21-2**

**ADOPTING A TEMPORARY BUDGET - TOWNSHIP**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:4-19, it is necessary to make appropriations for the period between the beginning of the budget year and the adoption of the budget, if any contracts, commitments or payments are to be made prior to the adoption of the budget for the new fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, a resolution making such temporary appropriations must be adopted not later than the thirtieth, but not prior to the first day of each year; and

**WHEREAS**, the total of the appropriations so made, exclusive of the amount so appropriated for interest and debt redemption charges, and for relief of the poor, shall not exceed 26.25% of the total of the appropriations made for all purposes other than interest and debt redemption charges and for relief of the poor in the budget for the proceeding fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the amounts of all such temporary appropriations shall be included under the correct headings in the amount appropriated in the budget as finally adopted;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Upper Deerfield, in the County of Cumberland, that the following statement of appropriations shall constitute the temporary budget of the Township of Upper Deerfield, effective to the date of the fiscal adoption of the local budget for the fiscal year 2021.
